

“Oh no it isn’t” ...Helmsley announces Panto themed Christmas Tree Festival and Festive Fun Day

- *Town celebrates its independent businesses with a Festive Fun Day to mark the third annual Small Business Saturday*
- *Popular Christmas Tree Festival returns for a fourth year*

Helmsley in Business has announced it is to hold its fourth annual Christmas Tree Festival and third magical Festive Fun Day this December - and in true Christmas style it's a great British Pantomime theme all round!

The Christmas Tree Festival will take place at the town's historic All Saints Church, with 30 beautiful trees which have been individually and creatively decorated by businesses and organisations in the town to fit the panto theme. From the traditional Pantomime Dame and Principal Boy to the Ugly Sisters and King Rat, visitors will be able to see the Helmsley take on all things panto every day, 10am to 4pm, from Saturday 5th December to Sunday 20th December 2015.

It has also been announced that on 5th December, Helmsley will again celebrate the town's many independent businesses by marking Small Business Saturday with a Festive Fun Day. The day encourages people to keep trade local and there will be activities run by local businesses, along with fun, games and entertainment for all the family taking place throughout the town from 10.30am to 3.30pm.

Some of the activities taking place include a Candy Cane Trail, a road train, festive music, a DJ and compere, children's fancy dress and novelty dog competitions, children's crafts, Christmas baking, games, rides, entertainers, choirs, bee keepers, food and drink tastings, a selfie portrait booth, stalls and of course a few surprises... (including a visit from the man himself - Santa!)

Showing their support for the event, Ryedale District Council has reduced all day parking in the long stay car parking to just £1.50 for 5th December.

Helmsley has a large concentration of independent, small businesses, with one business for every 14 residents, and has been a high profile supporter of Small Business Saturday since it launched in the UK in 2013.

Local business owner Katie Atkinson of KVA Planning Consultancy, who is a member of the Helmsley in Business (HiB) Christmas Committee, said: "The last few years has seen

Helmsley put on Christmas events like never before - and the feedback is always great, from residents, visitors and business owners alike. So this year we're going bigger and better than ever! The Christmas Tree Festival promises to offer lots of smiles, given the pantomime theme, and with our beautiful Church as the backdrop, will no doubt add a magical touch to the festive season.

Tony Scott, owner of Scotts and HiB committee member, said: “Small Business Saturday is all about keeping trade local and discovering the variety and quality of local traders. It is the UK's most successful small business campaign - last year 16.5 million adults went out to support a small business on Small Business Saturday and 64 per cent of people in the UK were aware of the campaign. This year it hopes to be even bigger and better - and in Helmsley we intend to do everything we can to make that happen!”
